“Embedded Librarian: Enhancing Student Learning through Collaboration”

On March 13, 2012, ALPS presented a free, online continuing education session on embedded librarianship by Kealin McCabe, Research and Learning Services Librarian, University of Northern British Columbia. Nearly 40 participants attended this informative session, with lots of questions and discussion.

Abstract: Librarians are leaving the confines of their libraries to reach students in new and innovative ways, working with class instructors to enhance student learning. Students are spending less time in the library and more time in the virtual environment in



order to complete their academic assignments. This shift has forced librarians to rethink the ways they reach out to students and contribute to their academic success.
