 - iv. Timing/Format: Wait and include survey content about the Position Statement. Invite expert input into survey content wording. Currently hosted on Google forms, but we have access to Qualtrics.
 - v. **ACTION**: David will draft survey/poll and invite input, then Lisa or Helen will upload to Qualtrics.
 - b. Proposal for BCLA Conference (Kevin)

- Background: In planning phase. Topic: What role can our sector play in tackling the climate crisis? InterLINK regional conversation (action focused) and/or broader session for BC-wide conversation.
- ii. Timing/Format: We need to submit a session summary to reserve space at BCLA. We are anticipating 60 min session, but not yet determined.
- iii. ACTION: Kevin will draft a BCLA session summary(ies).
- iv. ACTION: Lisa will enquire with Rina about BCLA session format (and possible hybrid/Zoom access), how much space/time to expect, how to coordinate with other climate-themed sessions, and the possibility of having a CAC meeting at the conference to workshop a project.
- c. Climate Change Position Statement Working Group
 - i. We're working out a meeting schedule. Next steps probably to reach out to groups and gather input good fit with survey/poll discussed above.

- b. Climate Preparedness [Something] Week?
 - i. Lots of possibilities. A week might be more effective than a day. Flexible timing. Could be BCLA or other org that starts it. Partnership possibilities. Speakers. Follow Science Literacy Week model. Coordinate to reduce implementation workload. SRC model to provide resources and support. Evolve and grow over time.
 - ii. Timing:
 - 1. Earth Day in April.

Nat'l Emergency Preparedness Week is May.

Climate Preparedness Week in is Sept.

Science Literacy Week is in Sept.

Shake-Out BC is October.

Ideally plan for main post-secondary academic year (Sept – March) so that academic libraries can more effectively participate. Perhaps plan for spring before forest fires begin.

- 3. Coordinate with the Libraries in the Global Arena series? (It will continue next year! More concrete. E.g. invite Mass. speakers.)

- iii. Focus/content: Emergency response and preparedness, neighborhood action, lots of topics to engage with, experts to invite. Mitigation. Justice and equity focused.
- iv. Nat Res Can is in charge of BC Shake-Out and flooding response. Federal libraries need mandate from Ottawa to participate.
- v. This project needs a lead. Continue discussion in Dec.
- c. City of North Vancouver <u>Climate and Environment Strategy</u>
 - i. This is available.
- d. City of Vancouver Climate Emergency Action Plan
 - i. Staff gave an update; not meeting the goals.
