BCLA Conference: debrief. Our session went very well (90-100 people attended).

Cataloguing fiction using appeal factors: Samuel Richmond, Head of Cataloguing at VPL and Anna dFiscussed their idea for a RA in a Day session on how library catalogues could serve readers better.

Samuel's session would be on subject cataloguing and its service (disservice) to RA public service librarians. We discussed a collaborative approach, with input from the audience. He has multiple concerns with traditional fiction cataloguing, as he believes it deprives patrons of the full experience of book discovery. He is seeking to get a full picture from a public service librarian of how or if we use Library of Congress subject headings and what methods we use to provide a service that bypasses current cataloguing practices.

We asked Samuel to extend an invitation to the BCCATs group to join our listserv and subscribe to our blog.

The next BCCATS meeting will be on Sept 23 (TBC) at the BC Co-op office. Members of this group are encouraged to attend.
