*Interesting RA tidbits:* 

- ➤ Welcome Sarah! Anthea recruited Sarah as our FVRL rep.
- Michelle: established a new "emerging local authors" collection, 175 entries, 2010-2014 published titles eligible, in English or French, professional-quality bindings only, kept at downtown branch, put into the regular catalogue, will monitor circ numbers, after 12 months all the high circs will stay in the collection, had a gala launch event, one copy of each title.
- ➤ Shelley: New Wesminster's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year! Lots of RA promotions being planned, details to follow.
- Anna: just graduated, working on-call for West Vancouver, starting a genre-based book club for recent SLAIS grads, where everyone reads a different subgenre of a genre (starting with historical romance)
- > Tim: VPL has a new RA toolkit (Tell Us What You're Reading) for staff that encourages staff to share current reads, rating titles on the intranet boosting staff engagement and identifying who reads what, should it be posted on the Library Toolshed?
- > Sarah: FVRL has launched Staff Picks bookmarks, with room to write the staff person's name and a brief note about the book.
- ➤ Theresa: participated in an LJ webcast on displays, talked about display continuity from display area to the collection shelves (breadcrumbs for patrons). Also: Chicago's One Book One Community program is all online.
- Virginia: Around the World in 80 Days new adult non-fiction themed book club, meet every 2 months, June 1 launch.
- ➤ Barbara: One Book One Community program is on hold. New Bibliocommons feature: events platform on VPL website, can link title to catalogue and includes book cover image.
- ➤ Jenny has been promoted. She is the new Manager of Learning Services in Library Administration, and she starts on May 4<sup>th</sup>. Surrey is looking into doing One Book One Surrey as well. <u>OLA's RA Committee's Best Bets</u>: discussion. We are going to do it too! Anna will coordinate. She is also still talking to David Wright

from Seattle, Sarah Foster from Whatcom County, and Stephanie Chase from Hillsboro Library in Oregon about a virtual Pacific Northwest RA network with monthly themed moderated sessions.
