 - Meghan: Chapters summer contest, take a photo of yourself reading
 - Meghan and Barbara are going to the Ampersand Library Day tomorrow at the Arbutus Club
 - ➤ Matthew: RA on <u>Unshelved</u> every Friday how can we submit something for this? Matthew will investigate. He is going to ALA in Chicago next week.
 - Tara: West Vancouver has a new monthly program called "Book Lovers' Round Table", has met three times so far, a small but dedicated group so far, moderated by a volunteered community leader, it's generating great booklists (they are getting Bibliocommons at some point this summer).

 - Tara: we should look into going to the Book Expo America (BEA). It's in New York for 2014 and 2015; Chicago in 2016, always in May.
- Beyond Hope conference: Jenny and Meghan had a great time in Prince George, particularly the RA-related sessions. Their session went well, 21 enthusiastic participants, very much worthwhile attending this conference.
- *BCLA Browser:* Matthew submitted an article re: the Author Talk session, Jenny submitted an article about Beyond Hope. We haven't had confirmation, so Matthew and Jenny will email Leanna to confirm receipt of our articles.
- Student reps update: Brad (UFV) and Matthew (SLAIS) are working on recruiting their replacements, will likely happen in September. We are still hoping to find a Langara student rep in September as well.
- Social media & blog: Meghan will post a blurb on the BCLA Author Talk and Beyond Hope on the blog and she'll alert Olivia (GVPL). GVPL is still posting on the blog, then Anthea (FVRL) for July. Matthew will post in the first week of August, and then Heidi (NVCL) will

Keynote speaker: Meghan and Jenny met David Wright, RA expert from Seattle Public Library, at Beyond Hope – and he'd be great and he's keen and affordable (hotel plus transportation; he'll drive up). Jenny will follow-up with him, and suggest topics for his talk: the importance of collaboration and the future of RA. She will also contact Christina/Annette to determine the process, and ask Allie about our current budget situation.

Other sessions:

- 1. Group activity: challenging RA questions: Mehj, Robbie and Barbara will look at the ones Jenny and Meghan used at Beyond Hope, and they'll come up with about six questions to work with. We'll have pretend patrons at the podium microphone asking the challenging RA questions and the audience can ask follow-up questions. We are looking for strategies and process, as well as answers to the questions. We will project the questions on the screen at the front.
- 2. Discussion about the "social benefits of fiction reading" by academics Matthew and Barbara didn't find much of obvious interest online locally. Mehj and Barbara will dig a bit further and report at the next meeting.
- 3. RA with ebooks: Tara and Meghan will investigate any other volunteers?
- 4. Possible closing "inspirational" speaker: <u>Max Wyman</u> Jenny will investigate his availability and costs.

Jenny will bring buttons. We still need to talk about the bookmark idea – next meeting. Barbara will look after the technical details: we want to add an audience microphone and an A/V cart. Barbara confirmed that we'll have wireless internet access and she'll get the password.

Food & Beverage: Barbara will check VPL's water bottle policy. Robbie will get a quote on coffee/tea/loaves from Blenz (we will buy whole loaves and cut them ourselves again). We'll get a couple fruit platters from Costco – which means we need forks and plates too.

Mehj will look at loaf prices and options for Uprising Bakery. Tara and Barbara will look into loaf prices for JJ Bean. We are probably looking at 15-20 loaves. Report back at next meeting and we'll make final decisions.

Jenny will draft a budget for the next meeting and will send it to BCLA after the next meeting. Jenny will draft a "VIP" list of people who will attend for free: organizers and speakers for Allie.
