- Meghan: lots of author events at Guildford library in Surrey coming up. She is attending an event at Book Warehouse in Vancouver this Thursday, called "Book Club Bonanza".
- ➤ Heather: libraries have requested more subject-area lists than ever before, particularly for Canadian content. She'll get us onto their e-newsletter list, there is

some RA in their issues.

- ➤ Heidi: discussion about the multimedia book "Night Film" by Marisha Pessl. It has a free app but the app hasn't been marketed very well. The book has been marketed extremely well. A bird icon prompts you to scan it with your smartphone for enhanced content, which is not executed all that well, but it's very interesting. A new genre in fiction, a big leap in format. Very fun and literary thriller/noir, published by DoubleDay, marketed on NPR, author was scheduled to appear at the Vancouver Writers Festival but cancelled. Can be read without using the app.
- ➤ Dana: there are Advanced Reader Copies (ARCs) for kids and teens, how about for adults? Likes the Bring Your Baby Bookclub at VPL.
- Naomi: New Westminster is putting some RA tools on their website. An interesting idea of putting reading with an activity (something used with children who have literacy challenges).
- Anna: is going to the JonArno Lawson (nonsense poetry) event at UBC, next Wednesday at noon.
- ➤ Giller long list was announced here in BC, all Central/East Coast authors
