## Interesting RA tidbits:

- ➤ Tim: he's now at the Central branch and is involved in a lot of RA projects. The immigrant/reading project got some funding, and VPL is looking at visually merchandising collections. He is taking an ALA e-course on readers' advisory, forms-base RA, good so far.
- Meghan: will continue to blog about cool things from ALA (i.e. incubator project, "read, ride, buy" commuter project and Edmonton's "Great Stuff", under Explore Staff Picks.
- Anna/Matthew: show and tell with the RA machine continues. Attended the Portland Zine Syposium (glad to see the Portland library there). Showed us an "Adult Summer Reading" brochure (bilingual, English/Spanish). Library is collecting local stories during its 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year. Powell Books has a Summer Reading Challenge: discussion about how Powell's has adopted a lot of library language and how libraries generally are adopting more retail/bookstore strategies. Looking at a recent copy of the Powell Book's map and that they make shifts that necessitate another map. Colour-coded store, make things easier to find. Staff at their info desks are also subject specialists. Discussion about pop-up/mobile libraries and bicycle outreach.

- Tara: running Persian book club, about 9-10 people every time. Discussion about cool places for pop-up libraries (i.e. the Passport Office, beach, Seabus, ferries, skytrain, on vacation (bring a book, leave a book). FVRL tried to get onto the West Coast Express and

the cost was prohibitive.

- ➤ Barbara: question how are libraries connecting programs with collections and people? Discussion: bookmarks, stickers (i.e. to put on books by authors from events); displays with "Borrow Me!" signage; Bibliocommons booklists that include the website link; local experts (non-library staff) create booklists on various topics. Biblio Events/"Learning Guide": city-wide calendar for Vancouver is in the works for cultural and arts and educational events, huge project, part of digital strategy.
- ➤ Theresa: RPL is revamping their website, will be a section highlighting RA and providing more RA services. Offering a Chinese book club in the fall at the Brighouse branch (VPL is running one this summer).
