A Quick Guide to Game-Based Programs You Can Run Right Away!

GAMING HOUR (ONGOING/WEEKLY)

This variety hour-like program can be used to highlight a variety of board & video games; thematic weeks like retro throwback, MAR10 Day, or Plastic Rock Band Camp go over well.

BOARD GAME OR TABLETOP MEETUP (ONGOING/WEEKLY)

This family-oriented program can feature a variety of tabletop games or focus thematically on one. Once established, encourage players to bring their own games to the meetup.

GAME JAM (ONGOING/WEEKLY OR BI-MONTHLY)

Set out a variety of gaming devices (dice, pencils, paper, tokens, etc.) and tell participants they have 30-60 minutes to create a playable game, with rules, to play with others.

GAME TOURNAMENTS (MONTHLY)

Host game tournaments with games such as Mario Kart, Smash Bros Ultimate, Halo, or Fortnite. Include small prizes. Partner with local game shops and school clubs.

GENERATIONAL/FAMILY GAME DAYS (MONTHLY)

Tabletop and video game-based programming featuring "throwback" games that parents & grandparents remember and can teach to young ones; or, vice versa with modern games.

VIRTUAL GAMING (WEEKLY TO MONTHLY)

Stream games such as Jackbox Trivia on YouTube, Twitch, or Discord where players can use an on-screen code to actively participate in your hosted game from anywhere they are.

PUZZLES OR STEM-BASED GAMES(PASSIVE)

Set out a table of puzzles (e.g. jigsaws, crosswords, word searches) or an assortment of building materials (e.g. Keeva planks or party cups) with a small challenge/task given to encourage creative building and contraptions
