- RW thanks everyone for attending the meeting
- Vacant positions were discussed secretary & urgently needed incoming president. RW thanked everyone for their continued help, dedication and for coming out to the meetings
- RW reminded people that the role of incoming president/president isn't as daunting as it seems
- Please reach out to RW or KW if there is any interest in the roles or questions about the roles.

- KW added that if the Executive positions do not get filled, YAACS will fold which will also include the loss of YSI (Youth Services Institute)
- RW discussed new student liaison positions. KW & RW had a meeting with Karen Sharkey from UFV (University of Fraser Valley). KW & RW have also been in talks with students from other Library and Library Tech schools and are looking at adding new student liaison positions. Students who are interested in having a liaison are asked to also speak to a faculty rep to see if they would also be interested.
  - The new positions will be trialed until the ASM (Annual Section Meeting) at which time they will be officially added as new positions.
  - KW & RW will be reviewing the Terms of Reference to ensure they accurately reflect the various and fluid roles.
- RW discussed the Virtual Continuing Ed position and expanding the language in the Terms of Reference to reflect this new position as well.

- KW attended the virtual BCTLA conference and also noted it was excellent with great speakers and presentations.
- Conference theme for 2023 is Social Justice.

## 4. Continuing Business

#### 2023 YSI

- Questionnaire results
- Volunteer opportunities
- Dates and formats
- Speakers (interest from LOVE BC, CWILL)
  - Most people are interested in a hybrid model for YSI
  - Some people would only like virtual
  - Most people were interested in Children's for group age of focus.
  - Topics of interest were: SEW (Social-Emotional wellbeing), Reconciliation, STEM, skills through books reading, engaging with parents of young babies, climate crisis and climate action, trauma informed programming, Indigenous learning, welcome back theme, pre-teen social development, EDI (Equity-Diversity-Inclusion)
  - Suggested keynotes Betsy from MotherGoose on the Loose, Monique Grey Smith.
    - RW the trend seems to be that everyone is interested in having it virtual, due to capacity and current number of volunteers we will likely go the route of virtual again.
    - SG asked if there could be "hubs" in different areas so that people could gather in person and have some component of an "in person" conference.
       RW agrees it's a great idea but would definitely require some volunteers and coordination.
  - Suggested dates were a wide variety, so the Executive may just choose a time or check in with people again.
  - People would like some format of keynote followed by lightning talks
  - RW suggested Katłįà Lafferty former climate writer in residence at West Van Library. Lots of experience working with unhoused people, Indigenous communities etc.
  - CWILL has expressed interest in participating in YSI or collaborating in some other capacity (KW: they attended the BCTLA conference this year and did a hybrid presentation)
  - LOVE has expressed interest in participating in YSI
     (<a href="https://loveorganization.ca/bc/">https://loveorganization.ca/bc/</a>) PR, TP & SG expressed support and interest in LOVE being a presenter.
  - SG used to work for Autism BC and has a connection that might be interested in AIDE - they are currently working on an online course for librarians about serving autistic patrons and their families (<a href="https://aidecanada.ca/">https://aidecanada.ca/</a>)
  - RW: Do we want a full day or half day YSI?
    - Discussion: TP conference fatigue is something to consider, half day is more appealing than a full day. Suggested 9:30-2:30 with a lunch break or even a shorter time without lunch..eg. 12:30-4:30 or 1:00-5:00

- RW: If it's shorter the ASM (Annual Section Meeting) could follow YSI, if YSI is held in the morning.
- TP mentioned she had recently attended the Keeping it Real conference which was 9:30-2:30 with a break and they had a keynote speaker and lightning talks - she felt it was the perfect length.
- RW suggested adding a section on the YAACS forum about YSI so that we can have some brainstorming/discussion about YSI 2023.
- RW we won't settle on a keynote as of yet, so that people have an opportunity to give more feedback and discuss.
- SG suggested a focus on middle-age age group
- TP really intrigued by climate crisis and climate action child activists but also feels trauma informed service and "welcome back" themes are important too.
- RW perhaps a theme that recognizes that kids are dealing with serious things in their lives and how we can support them.
- TP a focus on "taking care" people come to conferences for new ideas so having some new information and new ideas.

#### **Terms of Reference**

- Wording changes for Student Liaison and potentially Continuing Ed coordinator positions
  - KW & RW will be reviewing the Terms or Reference and adjusting the wording to reflect the new student liaisons and the Continuing Education Coordinator virtual position role.
  - Reviewing the language around section officers being required to have a BCLA membership. Rina said we can add something in our bylaws that we don't require membership, or that we allow the President to waive membership fees on a case by case basis.
