Red Cedar Book Award (Marilyn MacPherson)

The Red Cedar Book Award is a readers' choice program for kids 8-12. Kids read Canadian fiction or non-fiction books and then vote on their favourite books. The program has extension activities and curriculum connections to support readers and teachers as well as access to the authors and illustrators. Voting will start in mid-May and the winners are announced the first week of June. Part of being part of the Red Cedar Award is advocating for the Award and children's literacy so we have the honour of being invited to talk on The Mentoree about engaging readers through programs such as the Red Cedar Award.

4. Youth Services Institute

- The 2024 YSI is on April 12 and will remain virtual. The decision to stay online was made based on cost and an attempt to keep it more accessible for people from across the province to attend.
- What we really need is speakers!

Brainstorming:

- Trauma-informed practice across all age groups
- Feedback from last year: more from <u>AIDE Canada</u>
- o Indigenous-language revitalization: children's books, story times, etc.
- Middle years programming, where we meet middle years patrons and when they come into the library; how to encourage library engagement; differences in rural and urban areas → lightning talk, roundtable discussion, breakout groups, etc.
- Lightning talks can be difficult to recruit for, but may be good opportunity to share and to practice presentation
- Changing needs of library workers, ex. taking on more social work in libraries; experiences from library staff who work with social workers, trauma-informed practice, etc.
- o Brooklyn Public Library did education about newcomers and children

5. Roundtable

- MM's podcast episode is being taped first week of February
- Tip to students: pick up a student librarian/practicum job! Ex. West Van looks for Student Librarians in Youth Department
- Many Library Tech students are doing practicums currently
- Can be good experience to work at small rural library: more opportunities to try different things and be in charge
- Good to get experience in academic libraries even if you plan to work with youth
- Students at Langara are organizing tours of museums, libraries, etc. YAACS could arrange something similar! Could do virtual tours.
- Consider opportunities to be on library boards or BCLA board; get a different perspective; We are always interested in having more Techs and Library Assistance involved
